# **Hand Surgery**

#### **Normal Symptoms:**

- Hand discomfort
- Mild swelling

### The following symptoms are <u>NOT</u> normal:

- Discolouration of the fingers
- Prolonged vomiting
- Excessive bleeding
- Redness around the incision
- Fever or chills
- Increasing swelling or numbness

If you experience any of the above symptoms you should seek medical advice. Please contact your nearest Emergency Department.

#### Diet:

Normal healthy diet as tolerated.

## Activity:

Joint exercises as directed.

## **Medications:**

You may use oral analgesia (eg Panadol) if required.

#### **Driving:**

No driving until follow-up appointment.

#### **Dressings / Wound care:**

- Keep bandage on till follow-up appointment
- Use the sling to protect hand
- Keep bandage dry

#### Hygiene:


Keep the bandage dry.

For a 24 hour period you are  $\underline{NOT}$  allowed to:

- Drive a car as directed by Doctor
- Operate machinery
- Drink alcohol
- Sign any legal or important documents.
